A warm welcome to the lead-up to the party season, especially to those of you receiving this newsletter for the first time.

The vote, at the IPENZ UK Association AGM in June, was in favour of changes to the Association rules to align them further with the standardised IPENZ Branch rules. These rule changes will improve the delivery of IPENZ services to members of IPENZ who are resident in the UK.

The most immediate effect of the change is to widen the membership to all IPENZ members in the UK, so here's a brief introduction to the Branch.

The IPENZ UK Association is now known as the UK Branch of IPENZ and, where possible, provides members of IPENZ resident in or visiting the UK, and other interested individuals, the services provided by IPENZ to its members, including acting as a vehicle for members to contact and meet each other.

A number of events are organised each year including social gatherings, technical meetings and visits to sites of engineering interest. Forthcoming events are listed below. Competence Assessments can also be arranged to be held in the UK on behalf of IPENZ National Office, Wellington.

IPENZ UK NEWS

IPENZ UK Association becomes UK Branch of IPENZ

In June the AGM vote was in favour of changes to the Association rules to align them further with the standardised Branch structure. The changes take effect from October 1st 2004 and the principal changes are:

- a) the membership will comprise all those financial members of IPENZ who are resident in the UK rather than just those who opt to become members of the Association (provision is made for some non-members of IPENZ to become Special Members of the Association, see below).
- b) the principal source of funding will be an annual grant from IPENZ National Office that is based on the number of IPENZ members resident in the UK.

The effect of this for existing members of the Association would be:

- a) no longer paying a local subscription to the Association but instead paying a branch levy as part of their annual fees to IPENZ (in practice, this will be seen as a reduction in the overseas member fees rebate received by members resident in the UK with the net financial effect likely to be close to zero, depending on the exchange rate between the pound and NZ dollar)
- b) a larger number of members which will provide greater diversity and richness of engineering experience within the Association and a larger pool of people to participate in our technical and social activities.

There are two principal deviations from the branch model:

- a) the Association will continue to maintain its own finances and bank account due to the impracticality of National Office dealing with small amounts of money in a different currency on the other side of the world
- b) the Association will continue to maintain its own Public Liability Insurance policy, as cover for our activities in the UK can not be provided by the policy held by IPENZ National Office.

Special Members prior to 1 October 2004 will now need to apply for special membership under the new rules. An application form is will be available on the website and will be sent out separately for that purpose. Such applications will be more closely scrutinised by the committee than in the past and some applicants will be declined and asked to join IPENZ instead.

At the insistence of IPENZ National Office, we are required to charge a higher subscription rate for those who wish to just belong to the UK Branch without being members of IPENZ. Refer to the website for price details.

OTHER NEWS & USEFUL INFORMATION

<u>Strike may disrupt Air New Zealand's operations</u> - the Service and Food Workers Union (SFWU) says possible strike action by ground staff has the potential to seriously affect both international and domestic services along with reservations, finance and cargo. No date has yet been set for any action. Negotiations are continuing in an effort to reach a settlement.

<u>Car running on milk</u> - Fonterra is running a car partly on ethanol produced from whey left behind during the manufacture of casein. Fonterra has struck a deal with petrol company Gull Petroleum to produce E10 - a fuel containing 10 per cent ethanol. It is hoped the results of the trial would lead to the fuel becoming commercially available in NZ.

<u>Commercial Space Flights</u> - A three-seat rocket plane, SpaceShipOne, has completed the first leg of its attempt to win the Ansari X Prize. The US\$10M prize will go to the first team to build a spacecraft without Government help, launch three people or their weight equivalent at least 100km straight up, and then repeat the feat within two weeks. Virgin founder Richard Branson plans to license the technology behind SpaceShipOne to build a fleet of five-seat spacecraft to offer US\$190,000 rides to space tourists beginning in 2007. There is some concern among customers of other Virgin services about reliability and on-time performance!

<u>Gift for those that have everything</u> – A robotic vacuum cleaner is now on the market for NZ\$2400. It steers with the aid of sonar and also has bump sensors. Now you can relax and do the housework at the same time.
