What do you find is the biggest difference between working in the UK and working in NZ?

The biggest difference is the culture, the work ethic. As well I'm not working for an engineering company, I'm working for a property-leasing consultant, in an internal engineering group alongside architects and planners.

Do you think working in the UK has benefited your career?

Yes, I have 2½ years experience and we work on smaller projects. There are a lot of senior people about to get information from which is very helpful.

What advice would you give to engineers coming over to the UK for their OE? Just enjoy yourself! The UK is wonderful. Have fun and enjoy the flow.
