Christmas Soiree - IEAust and IPENZ


Friday 30 November

Hays Quarterly Report - Engineering in New Zealand

Structural Engineers with seismic design and analysis experience, Transportation Engineers and Planners, Civil Engineers, Geotechnical Engineers and Structural Drafters are all in demand due to the Christchurch rebuild and recovery. Release of the blue print has meant that more building design and preconstruction work is now taking place in both the residential and commercial sector. According to Sam Atkins of Hays Globalink, "job offers will be made swiftly to New Zealand-experienced structural engineers and geotechnical engineers as there will be great competition for these professionals."

As the civil repair work gathers pace over the coming months there will be a significant amount of work for the region causing increases in demand for Site Engineers, Project Engineers and Project Managers.

Professional Quantity Surveyors, Senior Project Managers (Consultancy), Project Engineers (civil), Site Engineers (civil), Project Managers (residential) and Engineering Geologists are also in demand. Although the work is Christchurch based, the design component is also outsourced to Auckland.

"The nature of this candidate-short market has meant that even more emphasis has been put on people moving from overseas including the UK, Australia and US, and employers are more open to consider candidates from regions outside of these countries if they have gained seismic design experience," Atkins affirms.

As demand continues to increase for candidates in this industry, salaries and value-adds for employees will become more common. Meanwhile, we are seeing salary increases for intermediate candidates moving to the region.
