Obituary – Graham Withers

We have the sad news to report that, Graham Withers, a stalwart of our IPENZ UK Branch, passed away over the summer on 3rd August 2016. Graham, who was 75 years old, died suddenly of a heart attack at his home in Sherborne, Dorset.

We have been in contact with his good wife, Jenni. After Graham's retirement, he and Jenni had moved to Dorset, from Reading, to be near family.

Graham was an active and leading person in our branch, being Hon. Secretary for many years, and Chairman for two terms. He was responsible for organising some great social events and site visits for members, and generally holding the committee to task and making sure the values of the branch and our rules were adhered to.



Our IPENZ Summer barbeques, at the Withers residence, were a great event, and Graham's planning list of things to do and not to do for the summer barbeque are still used today – possibly less alcohol now, though.

Graham and Jenni moved to New Zealand in April 1968, working for Sir Alexander Gibb for eight years on the great hydro-power and tunnel schemes at Tongariro in the North Island, and living in Turangi. Their two daughters, Susan and Louise, were born there, and they all had a great love for New Zealand. As Jenni recently said, "It was the most wonderful time of my life". Jenni warmly told us how Graham's employers quietly screened her before they got married for potential suitability of being the wife of an engineer on assignment in New Zealand – how times have changed!

Graham's affection for New Zealand and engineering drew him into the IPENZ UK Branch fold in 1987, and we were able to benefit immensely from his knowledge and enthusiasm.
